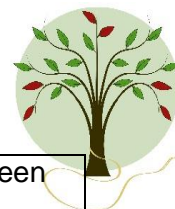

School Updates	<p>School uniform We are looking at changing Reception, possibly whole school t-shirts to red or navy. Parent Reps to ask for feedback</p> <p>Reports Currently three reports a year. Spring and Summer report provide main details of children's achievements. Previous feedback has been that the settling in report has not been useful.</p>
Reception	<p>Keeping clean- t-shirts and aprons Children are encouraged to wear aprons but it can be tricky to force them during free flow.</p> <p>Transition 13th July children will spend an afternoon in their new class with their new teacher.</p> <p>Assembly Class assembly at 9.15, all parents invited to attend. They will perform to year 1 and 2 and any sibling.</p>
Year 1	<p>Homework - could we submit pictures electronically where relevant? Absolutely, send homework to info@dormansland.surrey.sch.uk</p> <p>Hair - I understand it has to be tied up when it's below shoulder length but I have seen plenty of longer hair worn down. It's not helping the lice situation! Regular reminders are sent out about hair, children are encouraged in school to keep it tied up if they take it down.</p> <p>Can they have paper list of spellings, or at least same process for all years? This is something we are mindful of, next year all classes will receive and be tested on spellings on the same day of the week, (there may be the occasional exception) All spellings books will be red.</p> <p>Will there be opportunity of more activity clubs to access from September when they go into yr 2? I know they mentioned football before but unless I am mistaken it is for the older year groups Various clubs are considered each year, we try to ensure that there is a spread across both key stages.</p> <p>My son attended Lego club twice and it then stopped working out no notice or explanation. What's happened to it?</p>

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	<p>Lego club kept going however with the good weather children had not been coming inside.</p> <p>Reading is still a concern for me. I don't feel they read often enough with their teacher. Or any staff to be honest. No feedback in diary when they read. And when they do read, it's only like 4 pages max. Can reading books be changed more regularly? If not, then perhaps an explanation as to why not.</p> <p>Internal records are kept by teachers, the focus of reading record books are for parent communication about reading at home and other notes. Children take part in other reading activities in school when the teaching of reading takes place. Although only three or four pages have been heard in school, teachers focus on the comprehension as well as teaching explicitly strategies for children</p>
