Dear Parents and Guardians,

1	Disruptive behaviour	1st Warning: Your teacher will remind you about choices being made
2	Disruptive behaviour continues	2nd warning: Your name is moved to Question mark. Key Stage 1- five times in a week = loss of golden time. Key Stage 2- three times in a week = loss of golden time.
3	Disruptive behaviour continues	3rd warning : Complete your work quietly in another class. Parents will be contacted. You will miss some playtime.
4	Behaviour continues	4th warning: You will be sent to Miss Newns with work to complete. Parents will be contacted.
5	Behaviour continues	5th warning: You will continue to work with Mr Cook or Mrs Davies. Parents will be contacted by a member of the Senior Leadership Team.

As we all know, maintaining a positive and respectful environment at our school is crucial for the well-being and progress of our children. As part of our school development priorities this year, we will be reviewing our 'Positive Relationships and Behaviour' policy and implementing a revised 5 stage approach. This model has been shared with children in assemblies and in the individual classes. The model reinforces our work on The Golden Thread of choice and is used alongside the 'Zones of Regulation' which helps to support children in identifying their emotions and how to self-regulate. We discuss with the children the choice they made and how they could change this next time.

We will be holding a Behaviour Workshop later in the year, with a focus on the systems in place and how these can support you at home as well as giving you an opportunity to share your views. As part of our emphasis on behaviour this year we are strengthening our communication with parents

regarding low level behaviours, both in class and the playground. This may result in an increase in telephone calls from class teachers.

All children at Dormansland have unique strengths and challenges, and it is our duty as educators and parents to guide our children toward making positive choices and developing the skills to enable them to reach their full potential. We firmly believe that with your support, we can work together to foster a culture of respect, responsibility, and empathy within our school community. We understand that change takes time, and there may be setbacks along the way. However, by working together, we can ensure that Dormansland Primary School remains a place where every child can thrive academically and emotionally.
